## Decisions, Decisions

(Moving Forward Post Bond Attempt)

Following the failed bond election in May, the JCC school board will be making another bond attempt. A major reason for this decision is due to the taxing structure of a bond vs. the taxing structure of our general and building funds. If we address our facility issues by "maxing out" our tax asking (or voting on a levy override), agricultural and horticultural land will be taxed at 75% of the property value. To address these exact, same facility issues through the passage of a bond, this same land would be taxed at 50% of the property value. Please remember this 50% valuation is only in regards to a bond. Agricultural and horticultural land will continue to be taxed at 75% of the value for general and building fund tax asking purposes.

The other factor in deciding to ask our patrons to vote on another bond is we cannot generate enough money to address our facility issues through "maxing out" our tax asking to the \$1.05 levy limit that is allowed by law. To go over this \$1.05 figure, a vote of the people is required (i.e. a levy override). By law, schools can only allocate a total of  $14\phi$  (of the \$1.05 levy limit) to the building fund. In order to go over the " $14\phi$  building fund rule," another vote of the people would be required, and the maximum asking allowed is  $17.5\phi$  by law. Currently JCC's Building Fund asking is  $6\phi$ , and this generates approximately \$450,000 per year. In short, this means a million dollar project would take at least three years to fund as some of the Building Fund dollars would still be needed and used for yearly repairs and maintenance. The passage of a bond issue allows serious facility issues to be addressed now and paid off over the life of the bond.

This 2nd bond vote will most likely occur in January. According to statute, a bond that has not been "substantially" changed cannot be put before the people until 6 months after the failed bond. The general election on November 8 isn't quite six months. This would put a special election just after the general election. However, in even numbered years, there is a "blackout" period surrounding primary and general elections that do not allow for special elections. For 2022, the "blackout" period begins September 1 and ends December 31. Therefore, the earliest JCC could present a bond in a special election would be early January 2023.

Rich Bacon Middle School Principal 402-864-4171 JCC intends to continue to work with the architecture firm of Clark-Enersen, the bond underwriter of DA Davidson and the construction management firm of Boyd-Jones. To make changes to the construction management firm, would require the board to again ask for proposals from firms. This would take considerable time, further delaying the process of moving forward with a construction project. If you recall, the reason a construction manager at-risk approach was chosen was due to the size and scope of the project. Wanting to make sure that quality work was done correctly was, and remains, a goal of the school board. A construction manager can do just that.

As of now, our school district (through the actions of the school board) has some decisions to make. We know there are projects within all three buildings that will need some attention. However, due to the constraints of the budget authority and levy limits, we will need to decide which projects need the most immediate attention and which projects are worthwhile in the long run. Thinking ahead, and still wanting to get all services to the Tecumseh Site, we have determined that the current high school is the building that we will most likely use in the future. Therefore, it would make sense to invest the bulk of funds into this building. Also, knowing that a new facility would still be (at least) a few years away, we will need to address any immediate concerns within the Cook Site and the Tecumseh Site Elementary. Look to further communications for updated building needs and cost estimates.

In future correspondences, we will continue to update everyone on JCC's facilities, costs to upgrade/renovate, and thoughts on an upcoming bond. Until then, please stop in with questions or ideas. Each student, grades 7-12, who plan to participate in NSAA sponsored activities during the 2022-2023 school year need to turn in a signed Parental Consent form. This must be done before a student is eligible for practice and competition in <u>any</u> activity that is under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association. By signing this consent form parents and students acknowledge that they understand there are risks involved in any activity. This parental consent form must be on file at school for every student who participates in NSAA activities.

All 7<sup>th</sup> grade students, and any student grades 8-12, who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the school representative once each year, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. This physical examination must be given during the school year in which the student participates or during the summer vacation period which precedes the school year in which the individual participates. Parental consent forms and physical evaluation forms can be picked up in the office at both sites. All athletes who plan to participate in a fall sport should take care of this prior to the beginning of fall practice on August 17, 2022.

### BACK TO SCHOOL PHYSICALS...

It is time to start thinking about physicals for sports and school participation.

- ALL Kindergarten students (entering school for the first time) are required to receive a physical/vision screening, and immunization screening from a healthcare provider.
- ALL 7<sup>th</sup> grade students are required to receive a school physical with immunizations reviewed and booster shots if needed.
- ALL students transferring from out-of-state require a school physical/vision screening, and immunization screening.
- ALL students, grades 7-12, that plan to participate in athletics will need a sports physical.

### NSAA physical forms are available at the Tecumseh and Cook sites.

Please bring completed physical clearance forms to your child's school after their physical is completed.

\*Please call your healthcare provider to schedule an appointment.

ALL PHYSICALS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO THE START OF SCHOOL, AND PRIOR TO THE START OF THE FALL ATHLETIC SEASON FOR ALL ATHLETES. Coaches will need to receive completed physical forms pri-

or to an athlete's participation in practice.

Lastly, all students, grades 9-12, who plan to participate in NSAA-sponsored activities during the 2022-2023 school year need to turn in a signed Parental Consent form. This must be done before a student is eligible for practice and competition in any activity that is under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association. The participating student and one of his/her parents or guardians must sign the certificate of consent and turn it into the school office.

Each student, grades 7-12, who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the superintendent, principal, or school representative once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. This physical examination must be given during the school year in which the student participates or during the summer vacation period which precede the school year in which the individual participates. Also, all incoming 7th graders, freshmen, and juniors must complete the ImPact Concussion test to establish a baseline in the event of a head injury. This test will be conducted by school officials and must be done before an athlete is allowed to practice or participate in a contact sport. Please contact the school if you have any questions and please take care of this prior to the **beginning of fall practice on August 8, 2022.**

### **Summary of the School Immunization Rules and Regulations**

Student Age Group	Required Vaccines
Ages 2 through 5 years enrolled in a school based program not licensed as a child care provider	4 doses of DTaP, DTP, or DT vaccine 3 doses of Polio vaccine 3 doses of Hib vaccine or 1 dose of Hib given at or after 15 months of age 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine 1 dose of MMR or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age 1 dose of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.  4 doses of pneumococcal or 1 dose of pneumococcal given on or after 15 months of age
Students entering school (Kindergarten or 1 <sup>st</sup> Grade depending on the school district's entering grade)	3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4 <sup>th</sup> birthday 3 doses of Polio vaccine 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age 2 doses of MMR or MMRV vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted. If the child has had varicella disease, they do not need any varicella shots.
Students entering 7 <sup>th</sup> grade	Must be current with the above vaccinations  AND receive  1 dose of Tdap (contain Pertussis booster)
Students transferring from outside the state at any grade	Must be immunized appropriately according to the grade entered.
