Decisions, Decisions

(To bond or not to bond.)

Following the failed bond election in May, and after much discussion and contemplation, the JCC school board will be making another bond attempt. This will most likely occur in the spring of 2023. According to statute, a bond that has not been "substantially" changed cannot be put before the people until 6 months after the failed bond. The general election on November 8 isn't quite six months. This would put a special election just after the general election. However, in even numbered years, there is a "blackout" period surrounding primary and general elections that do not allow for special elections. For 2022, the "blackout" period begins September 1 and ends December 31. Therefore, the earliest JCC could present a bond in a special election would be early January 2023.

JCC intends to continue to work with the architecture firm of Clark-Enersen, the bond underwriter of DA Davidson and the construction management firm of Boyd-Jones. To make changes to the construction management firm, would require the board to again ask for proposals from firms. This would take considerable time, further delaying the process of moving forward with a construction project. Furthermore, JCC's administration and board of education has been very pleased with the efforts and commitment of these firms in serving our district. If you recall, the reason a construction manager at-risk approach was chosen was due to the size and scope of the project. Wanting to make sure that quality work was done correctly was, and remains, a goal of the school board. A construction manager can do just that.

As of now, the school district (through the actions of the school board) has some decisions to make. We know there are projects within all three buildings that will need some attention. However, due to the constraints of the budget authority and levy limits, we will need to decide which projects need the most immediate attention and which projects are worthwhile in the long run. Thinking ahead, and still wanting to get all services to the Tecumseh Site, we have determined that the current high school is the building that we will most likely use in the future. Therefore, it would make sense to invest the bulk of funds into this building. Also, knowing that a new facility would still be (at least) a few years away, we will need to address any immediate concerns within the Cook Site and the Tecumseh Site Elementary. Look to further communications for updated building needs and cost estimates.

Rich Bacon Middle School Principal 402-864-4171 Something to consider is how the taxing structure of a bond differs from the taxing structure of a school's general & building funds. When taxing for general fund and building fund purposes, agricultural and horticultural land is taxed at $\frac{75\%}{50\%}$ of the value. However, in the successful passing of a bond, that same land is taxed at $\frac{50\%}{50\%}$ of the value for the purposes of the bond (in addition to the general fund and building fund tax asking at 75% of the value). In short, addressing our facility needs via a bond allows a portion of the tax asking to be shifted away from agriculture. Passing a bond then allows the building fund tax asking to be lowered significantly, as not as much would be required for repairs and renovations.

To address facility needs via the general and building funds, the following budgeting rules apply. (Please note - This option taxes agricultural and horticultural land at 75% of its market value.)

- 1) The tax asking on the general fund and building fund is capped at the \$1.05 levy limit. In order to go over that amount, a vote of the people is required (i.e. "a levy override"). JCC's current levy limit is 99¢.
- 2) The most any school can put into their building fund is 14¢. In order to go over that amount, a vote of the people is required, and the maximum building fund asking is 17.5¢ by law. JCC's current building fund asking is 6¢ and generates approximately \$450,000 per year. This means a million dollar facility repair project takes approximately three years to fund as some of the Building Fund dollars will still be used for yearly repairs and maintenance.

The Purpose of New Handbooks

You may have noticed that this year's handbooks look very different. The handbooks JCC had been using date themselves back to 1990's Tecumseh Public Schools with a generous splash of Nemaha Valley Public Schools being added in 2007.

When Nemaha Valley and Tecumseh merged in 2007, Nemaha Valley had recognized KSB School Law for legal counsel and Tecumseh Public Schools had recognized Perry Law Firm. Upon merging to become Johnson County Central Public Schools, and after Mr. Jack Moles was selected as the superintendent, the decision was made to keep all the Tecumseh policy by Perry Law Firm but to identify KSB School Law as legal counsel.

Therefore, much of the handbook for JCC was developed through Perry Law Firm, however updates to policies would come through KSB School Law. This created quite a task as policy updates due to new or amended laws would be sent to JCC with an identifying policy number that did not match JCC policies. JCC policies (Perry Law Firm policies) would then need to be located by topic and the new wording (KSB School Law wording) would need to be manipulated to fit in.

In the fall of 2021, I presented these issues to the board and recommended that we fully adopt KSB School Law policies for the 2022 school year. The board voted in favor of this and over the last year JCC's administration read through all the policies making appropriate changes and presenting the policies to the board for approval. As these policies directly affect our handbooks (which are an extension of policy), the handbooks needed to be edited as well. This summer, the administrators met to go through the handbooks to make sure wording matched the updated policy.Now, JCC's identified legal counsel of KSB School Law, JCC's policies and handbooks are all streamlined!
