## FINANCIAL \& OPERATING EFFICIENCIES

Financial Efficiency

- Transportation savings.
- Utilities savings (HVAC, water \& sewer, sanitation services, energy).
- Maintenance savings.
- Infrastructure updates (Internet wiring, cabling, communication services)
- At this point in time, our best estimate of "one site" savings is .07 cents on our levy. In real dollars, this amounts to spending an additional $\$ 511,000$ each year to operate 3 buildings at our two sites.


## Staff Efficiency, Collaboration \& Synergy

- Elimination of staff travel time between sites.
- Elimination of duplicity of services (food services, maintenance, custodial, clerical).
- Utilization of staff strengths for all students as opposed to being limited to teaching at one site, or losing student time due to travel.
- Allows staff to work together more effectively.
- One site allows administration to be off-campus for school related events without leaving the school unsupervised as other administrators would still be present.


## Safety

- Reduced student travel time on buses.
- Updated secured entries, doors and windows.
- Ensure all classrooms to be able to dial 911 in the event of an emergency and that all alerts are able to be heard throughout the building.
- Eliminate need for students to leave a building to receive services in another building.
- Provide dedicated pick-up and drop-off lanes as opposed to using a city street.
- Updated ADA and Fire Safety facilities.

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## What's Different About the 2023 Bond?

- Position On the Proposed Property
* The competition gym is now on the West side of the plan to utilize the natural slope of the property. This eliminates some dirt work and saves on costs.

- CTE (Career \& Technical Education) or Shop spaces are now included in the 2023 plan. The 2022 plan did not include these which meant shop classes would have been held in the current high school.
- The wrestling practice room is now included in the 2023 plan. The 2022 plan did not include this space which meant renovating the lower level of the current high school to accommodate a wrestling practice space.
- The District Business Office and Superintendent Office are both now included in the 2023 plan. These spaces would have been in the current high school with the 2022 plan.
- The 2023 plan's total square footage is 123,940 square feet. The 2022 plan was 124,660 square feet. The 2023 plan is 720 square feet less than the 2022 plan, however it includes space for ALL JCC's programming needs.
* Decreasing the square footage while adding spaces was made possible by eliminating some hallway spaces, streamlining the design and cutting down the square footage of some specialized high school/middle school classrooms.
- The total cost of the 2023 bond is $\$ 49.5$ million. The 2022 bond was $\$ 43$ million.
* Rising interest rates and rising costs of construction contributed to the increase in the total cost.

## To: $\mathbf{6}^{\text {th }}, 7^{\text {th }}, \boldsymbol{\&} \mathbf{8}^{\text {th }}$ Grade Students and Parents

Middle School is a critical step in a student's education. It presents new changes and challenges. We hope to help make this a smooth transition with the Fall Walk-Through by allowing students to see their schedules, find their rooms and lockers, and meet with their teachers. This time will also allow the parents to see what is expected of their children in each class regarding homework, lecture notes, deadlines, note taking, etc.

The Fall Walk-Through will begin at $6: 00 \mathrm{pm}$ in the commons area where students will receive their 2023 - 2024 schedules as well as forms to be completed. Following a short welcome in the main gym, students and parents will be dismissed to the student's $1^{\text {st }}$ period class. Each period will meet for approximately 5 minutes. During this time teachers will explain their expectations and guidelines for their classes, plus provide an opportunity for parents and students to ask questions. After the last period, forms will be collected in the commons area. All students are expected to come prepared for each class with paper, pencils/erasers, pens, highlighter, Kleenex, etc. *Student Handbooks will be available online.

Lunch money, Activity fees, iPad Insurance and Instrumental rental fees will be collected in the commons area following the Walk-Through. (Separate checks are requested for each separate account). All lunches are to be paid in advance. *Free \& Reduced lunch applications will be available.
School physicals are required for ALL students entering the $7^{\text {th }}$ grade and immunizations must be up to date! School physicals are also required for all $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students who are participating in any sport.

## 2022-2023 Community Service Awards

All hours must be volunteer without financial compensation. Students who are eligible for the awards can complete the Community Service Award form and turn it into the counselor's office by April 1 of each school year. Now that the school year has come to a close, it is time to look forward to the next! The weight room will be open starting May 30th and run through July 28th. There will be three sessions in the morning and one in the evening that athletes will have the chance to get in and work out. The weight room will be open Monday-Friday with session times running from 6:30 AM-7:30AM (HS BOYS), 7:30 AM-8:30 AM (HS GIRLS), 8:30 AM-9:30AM (JUNIOR HIGH MIXED), and 6:00 PM-7:00PM (OPEN MIXED) ${ }^{* *}$ except Fridays. The coaches wanted to try something a little different this year and separate the genders so the athletes could work more in a teamoriented atmosphere. Athletes are strongly encouraged to attend 4 out of 5 days a week and to be in attendance on a regular basis. It is very important that our athletes take advantage of these opportunities to increase their abilities and give us the best chance to compete in the upcoming school year. Please help keep your athlete accountable with the weight room and the various sport-specific camps they will be asked to attend! Summer is a very important time to develop themselves, hone in on their skills, and be together with their teammates.

Lastly, all students, grades 9-12, who plan to participate in NSAA-sponsored activities during the 2022-2023 school year need to turn in a signed Parental Consent form. This must be done before a student is eligible for practice and competition in any activity that is under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association. The participating student and one of his/her parents or guardians must sign the certificate of consent and turn it into the school office.

Each student, grades 7-12, who expects to participate in athletic contests shall present to the superintendent, principal, or school representative once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. This physical examination must be given during the school year in which the student participates or during the summer vacation period which precede the school year in which the individual participates. Also, all incoming 7th graders, freshmen, and juniors must complete the ImPact Concussion test to establish a baseline in the event of a head injury. This test will be conducted by school officials and must be done before an athlete is allowed to practice or participate in a contact sport. Please contact the school if you have any questions and please take care of this prior to the beginning of fall practice on August 7, 2023.

## BACK-TO-SCHOOL PHYSICALS

Beginning May 1st, any athlete/student is eligible to schedule and complete a school physical/sports participation form for the next school calendar year. We encourage all students to get this scheduled and completed as early as possible

It will help our Medical offices from becoming overwhelmed with school physicals in August and September and keep the schedules open for other medical visits. Clinics run into problems when the days fill up with physicals and there is no time for other needs.


Our providers prefer to have all physicals done in the clinic setting in case there are other findings during this visit that need other tests done as well as making sure immunizations are current.

## BACETD SCHDDE PHESECALS...

It is time to start thinking about physicals for sports and school participation.

- ALL Kindergarten students (entering school for the first time) are required to receive a physical/vision screening, and immunization screening from a healthcare provider.
- ALL $7^{\text {th }}$ grade students are required to receive a school physical with immunizations reviewed and booster shots if needed.
- ALL students transferring from out-of-state require a school physical/vision screening, and immunization screening.
- ALL students, grades 7-12, that plan to participate in athletics will need a sports physical.
