## JCC's Three Major Resources

(And how to most efficiently utilize them.)
When providing education for our students, there are three major resources to utilize: people (staff), facilities and finances. The amount that a school can finance to budget for the school year has limitations by law. These are the Budget Authority, Basic Allowable Growth Rate, Property Tax Authority, Basic Allowable Growth on Property Tax Authority and Levy Limit.

Budget Authority = The total amount of funds that may be budgeted to be expended during a school fiscal year. In the General Fund, this includes special education expenditures, special grant funds and non-special education expenditures.

Basic Allowable Growth Rate $=$ (i.e. How much expenditures can grow.) The basic allowable growth rate for 2022/23 was $2.5 \%$. May also be referred to as BAGR.

Property Tax Authority (LB 243) = Certified amount of Property Taxes each district can request in total for the General and Special Building fund.

Basic Allowable Growth on Property Tax Authority = How much your revenues can grow, then based on student growth, LEP (Limited English Proficiency numbers) \& poverty may increase from there. Limited at $3 \%$ unless $70 \%$ of the board approves, otherwise can be up to $7 \%$.

Levy Limit $=$ a restriction on the tax requests for all taxing funds for a school district. The statutory maximum levy is $\$ 1.05$ plus exclusions per $\$ 100$ of assessed valuation for all taxing funds. Bond Principal and Interest are exempt from the Levy Limitation. May also be referred to as the levy lid.

Budget Authority is calculated one of three ways:
Budget Based $=($ General Fund Budget of Expenditures - Special Grant Funds - Special Education Budget of Expenditures - General Fund Lid Exclusions) X 1.025

Student Growth Adjustment $=($ General Fund Budget of Expenditures - Special Grant Funds - Special Education Budget of Expenditures - General Fund Lid Exclusions) + (Student Growth Adjustment + Student Growth Correction)

OR
Formula Needs Based $=(($ Formula Needs X 1.10) $-(\operatorname{SPED} X 1.025))$
JCC's Budget Authority is derived from the Budget Based calculations.
When building the budget for the upcoming school year, the district cannot exceed any of the limits. The only one that can be exceeded is the levy limit. However, this can only be done with a vote of the people. Therefore, if we want to add programming to the curriculum or activities, the funds to do so must be with the limits provided.

Over the last four years (not including the current year), personnel (wages/benefits/retirement) accounts for $73.2 \%$ or an average of $\$ 6.7$ million per year.

That all being said, there is not an unlimited supply of money for staff to be utilized to provide services at JCC's two sites and within the three buildings. As we have some duplicity of services at both sites, increased transportation costs to get students to one site or the other, time lost due to staff traveling during the day and the higher cost to maintain and provide utilities for both sites and all three buildings, inefficiencies in time, money and use of personnel exist. The solution (without cutting programming or activities for students) would be to get all programming to one site, where staff can fully be utilized without duplication of services and with the least amount of transportation.

Until that happens, there will be decisions to try to best utilize all three resources. This may be providing programming for some students in locations to best utilize staff or facilities. The fact is, neither site can house all students, staff and programming in their current state without major renovations. This becomes the sticking point: How much do we invest in our old facilities before it becomes more financially prudent to invest in new facilities?

## Kindergarten Enrollment

For the 2024-2025 School Year
Johnson County Central Public Schools kindergarten registration and visitation day is Monday, April 8, 2024, from 9:00-11:30 a.m. at the Tecumseh site. Parents will attend a short presentation where you will be introduced to the faculty that will be working with your child and given the necessary paperwork for enrollment. At the conclusion of the parent presentation you will be asked to leave so that the kindergarten children can experience a half-day of school on their own. Your child will be exposed to curriculum and activities that they will encounter next year. You will return to school at 11:30 a.m. to pick-up your child.

What to bring on April 28, 2023
(report to the kindergarten room- no office sign-in required):

* State sealed birth certificate
* Immunization records
**** If you don't have these or cannot find these now that's okay, but they are a state requirement for all Nebraska kindergarteners prior to attending class.

Students reaching age 5 on or before July 31, 2024 are eligible for Kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year.

Students who will reach the age of 5 between August 1 and October 15 this year, can be enrolled for the 2024-2025 school year. However, the student must demonstrate through JCC's recognized assessment procedure that they are capable of performing the work of Kindergarten. JCC School Board Policy 5055 states:
"The board delegates to the elementary principal responsibility for determining whether the conditions of this policy have been met. The elementary principal may deny early enrollment of a child who meets the early enrollment criteria if, in the principal's professional judgment, the child lacks the academic or social skills to be successful in the district's kindergarten program."

Early enrollment requests for the 2024-2025 school year were to be submitted by March 29, 2024.

## New English Class Opportunity

Next year, Johnson County Central will be offering new English courses for juniors and seniors to help prepare them for college and life after high school. If you are the parent of a senior or junior who plans to attend college, please consider encouraging your student to enroll for these courses. In the fall, I will be teaching a course titled Research Methods where students will have an opportunity to hone their research skills before moving on to college. As the world of public education changes, the expectations at the college level remain exceptionally rigorous leaving many students overwhelmed with college-level research. This course will offer students a chance to dive deeper into the nuances of research in various content areas- not just in English. Students will be able to direct much of their research during the second quarter towards a content area related to a career field of their interest giving them direct application to their future education and careers.

The second semester course will be called Practical Writing and will consist of more applicable writing exercises to help prepare students for life after high school. The primary focus will be writing and editing college and scholarship application essays, a task that can often get overlooked during a student's busy weekly schedule. ## NOTES FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL COUNSELOR Mrs. Olivia Reuter

Sign Up Now: June $8^{\text {th }}$ ACT

We are planning to offer the Saturday, June 8th ACT at JCC High School. Right now, we only have four students signed up, they will cancel our site if we don't have at least 20 students signed up to test. To test at JCC, students do not necessarily have to be students at JCC, they can be enrolled at other schools in the area as well. Everyone who wants to test, registers online and pays their testing fee on the act.org website. In order for the JCC testing site to show up, students must choose paper testing and not computer testing. We only offer paper/pencil ACT testing here. The deadline for registration without a late fee is May $3^{\text {rd }}$. Students can register between May $4^{\text {th }}$ and May $19^{\text {th }}$, but they will have to pay a late fee. The fee to test without writing is currently $\$ 68$. The ACT test with writing is $\$ 93$. In most cases, colleges and universities do not need a writing score to consider students for academic scholarships. Students on the free and reduced lunch program may be available for a fee waiver for June testing. Any JCC high school student who wants to test and who thinks they may be eligible for a waiver should see Mrs. Reuter as soon as possible. Waivers are in limited supply.

## Project Aware

Project Aware is a program associated with the Nebraska Family Help Line, Children's Nebraska, and the Nebraska Department. The goal of this program is to help Nebraskans understand that if they feel like they can't make it through the day, it's OK to reach out to a trusted professional. Just like going to the doctor when you have a pain, it's healthy to seek help with your mental health as well. Project Aware is working to end the stigma on mental health in rural Nebraska. ## James M. Cox Scholarship Program- Applications Must Be Postmarked By April 15th

The James M. Cox Scholarship Foundation offers fifty Nebraska high school seniors a one-time scholarship of $\$ 2000$. All JCC seniors have been emailed this scholarship information twice. They can download the application from their email and type directly into the form on their iPad by using Notability. In order to be considered for a scholarship award, seniors in high school must:

1. Reside in Nebraska, with special consideration given to students residing in the eastern one-third of the state;
2. Demonstrate financial need;
3. Demonstrate a likelihood of academic success in chosen field of study;
4. Attend a Nebraska-based institution of higher learning;
5. Complete and sign the Application;
6. Include a certified copy of your high school transcript;
7. Include two letters of recommendation from instructors, advisors or counselors; and
8. Include an educational commitment essay of no more than 1 page relating to the impact of a higher education on your permanent career objectives.
9. Other factors, obstacles or extenuating circumstances of the family such as financial burden, medical expenses, death of a parent, and/or disabilities factor into the decision-making process.
