- Moving to one site and making the appropriate renovations and additions to do so.
- Building on the proposed 52 acres North of the current football field in Tecumseh.

Of the main goals for the board is to:

- 1. Get all programming to one site.
- 2. Provide for the future facilities needs of the district.

Mrs. Jill Jensen Cook Site Registered Nurse



#### How to Become a Substitute Teacher

Schools are always in need of good substitute teachers. For the 2025-2026 school year, substitute pay for one day will be \$185.

If substituting is something you are interested in, there are currently two ways to substitute in Nebraska classrooms.

The following information was taken directly from the Nebraska Department of Education's website. For more information, you can navigate there directly by following this link:

https://www.education.ne.gov/tcert/substitute-teacher/

- **Local Substitute** "Applicants who do not have or have not finished their educator preparation program but have at least 60 hours of college credit."
  - A Local Substitute Permit can be issued for teaching 90 full-time days per school year
    for those who apply and meet the requirements listed below. Once issued, a Local
    Substitute Permit expires August 31st in the fifth year following the year of issuance.
  - The requirements for a Local Substitute Permit includes the following:
    - An application and fee in the TEACH system (Please note that registration for TEACH is required before an application can be submitted.)
    - Fingerprints (Only required if someone has lived outside of Nebraska in the past five years.)
    - Transcript(s) showing at least 60 semester credit hours
    - Human Relations Training
- **State Substitute** "Applicants who have completed an educator preparation program or have held a regular Nebraska teaching certificate or comparable and equivalent certificate from another state."
  - A State Substitute Teaching Permit can be used to teach in all endorsement areas in all Nebraska schools. Someone who holds a state substitute permit may be employed to teach on a non-contractual basis (cannot be the teacher of record). Once issued, a state substitute permit expires August 31st in the fifth year following the year of issuance.
  - The requirements for a State Substitute Teaching Permit include the following:
    - An application and fee in the TEACH system (Please note that registration for TEACH is required before an application can be submitted.)
    - Fingerprints (Only required if someone has lived outside of Nebraska in the past five years.)
    - Official Transcript(s)
    - Institutional Verification This form is used to show that an educator preparation program was completed and is sent electronically to Nebraska colleges and universities.
    - Educator Certificate A certificate is only required for those who have not been certified in Nebraska
    - Human Relations Training

and 6:00 PM - 7:00 PM (OPEN MIXED) \*\*except Fridays.

Athletes are strongly encouraged to attend 4 out of 5 days a week and to be in attendance on a regular basis. It is very important that our athletes take advantage of these opportunities to increase their abilities and give us the best chance to compete in the upcoming school year. Please help keep your athlete accountable with the weight room and the various sport-specific camps they will be asked to attend! Summer is a very important time to develop themselves, hone in on their skills, and be together with their teammates.

Lastly, all students, grades 9-12, who plan to participate in NASA-sponsored activities during the 2025-2026 school year need to turn in a

signed Parental Consent form. This must be done before a student is eligible for practice and competition in any activity that is under the jurisdiction of the Nebraska School Activities Association. The participating student and one of his/her parents or guardians must sign the certificate of consent and turn it into the school office.

Each student, grades 7-12, who expects to participate in athletic present contests shall to superintendent, principal, or school representative once each year, before actual participation in any interschool sport, a physician's certificate on a form recommended by the NSAA that he/she is physically fit for athletic participation. This physical examination must be given during the school year in which the student participates or during the summer vacation period which precede the school year in which the individual participates.

Please contact the school if you have any questions and please take care of this prior to the **beginning of fall practice on August 11, 2025**.

# College Preparation Strategies

#### Test Scores

Take the Test four times to get your highest score possible. (Students in Federal Free & Reduced lunch programs can take 2 - 4 free Tests).
Colleges only consider your highest scores.

#### Apply

Create more competition and earn more generous scholarships by applying to at least 5 four-year schools. If you are only considering two-year colleges, apply to at least 2 schools.

#### Finish Strong

Maintain a high GPA. Most academic scholarships consider both GPA and test scores. Also, excel in at least one extracurricular activity. Create a 90-second video to show your skills to colleges. The dollar amount in each box represents the tuition cost (after merit-based scholarships) that a student with the ACT test score (listed across the top of each table) would pay for one year of tuition (15 credits per semester) at that college. (non-tuition costs – fees, housing, meals, and books – often add up to an additional ~\$12,500 per year.)

\$1000 Dark Blue boxes signify automatic scholarships (as listed on the college's website). Automatic awards often also require a minimum GPA or class rank.

Light gray boxes signify eligibility for the award, which can require a separate application.

Blank boxes signify no merit-based scholarship based primarily on that Test score at this college; therefore, the student might expect to pay full tuition. The student should still apply for other merit-based and need-based scholarships.

If an entire row is blank, the school does not organize its scholarships by test score or does not provide this specific information on its website. **An asterisk \* means that fees are included in the school's base tuition,** which lowers the remaining non-tuition costs (textbooks, housing, and meals) from approximately \$12,500 to approximately \$11,000 per year.

If a school offers a non-renewable award, the award is averaged through the years of attendance. For example, if a four-year school offers a one-year award of \$5000, the amount is \$1250 less than total tuition, as the scholarship is divided by 4.
